What is Title I?

Hudson High School is identified as a Title I school as part of the *Every Student Succeeds Act* (ESSA). What is it?

Who is it for?

All students participating in the Title I, Part A program, and their families are encouraged and invited to fully participate in the opportunities described in this plan. Hudson High School will provide full opportunity for the participation of parents and family members with limited English, with disabilities and of migratory children.

Where is it available?

This plan is sent home in the beginning of the year with the Annual Title I letter. It is also available on our website www.hhs.pasco.k12.fl.us and in the Title I Family and Community Binder located in the front
